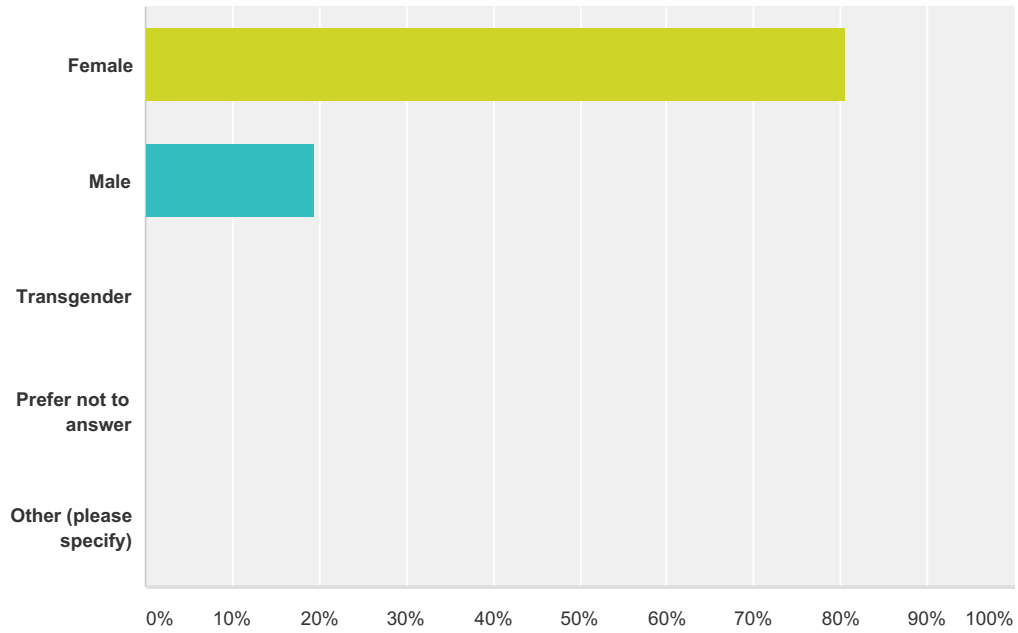

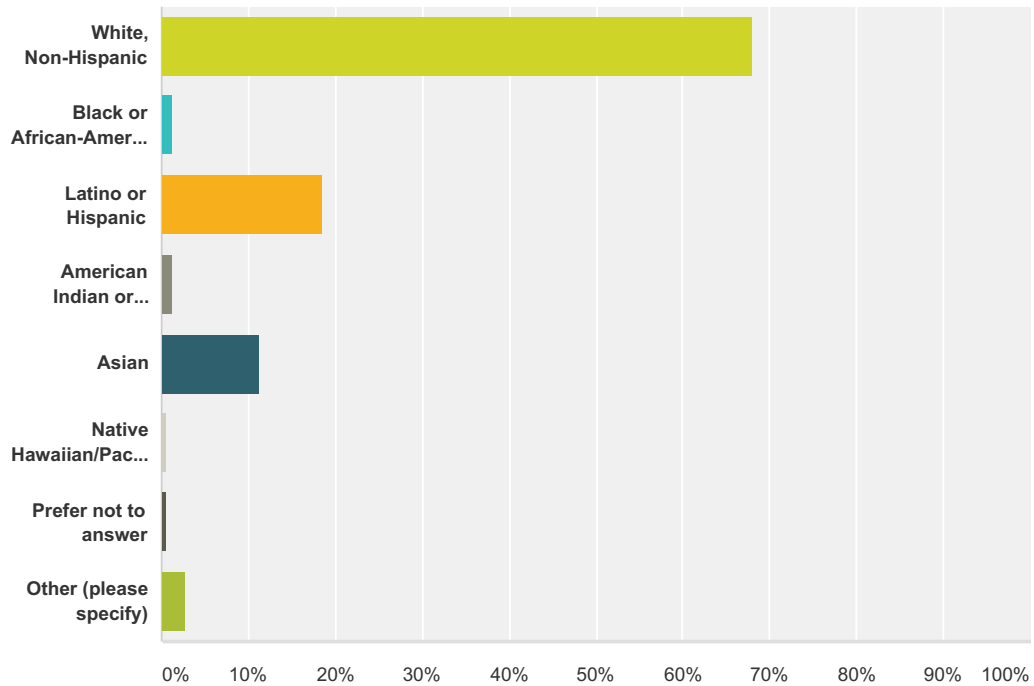

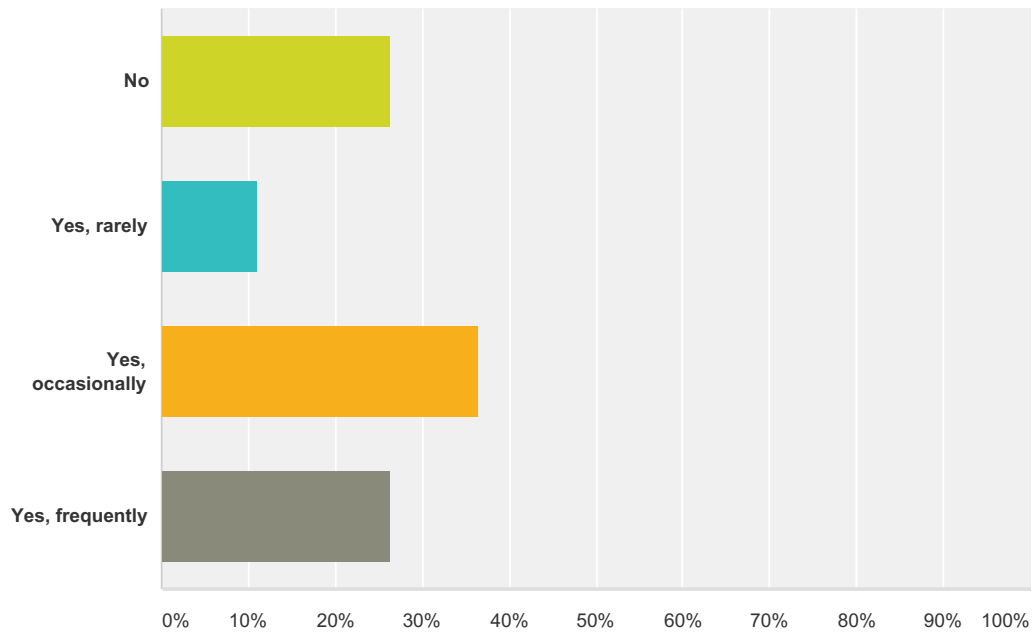

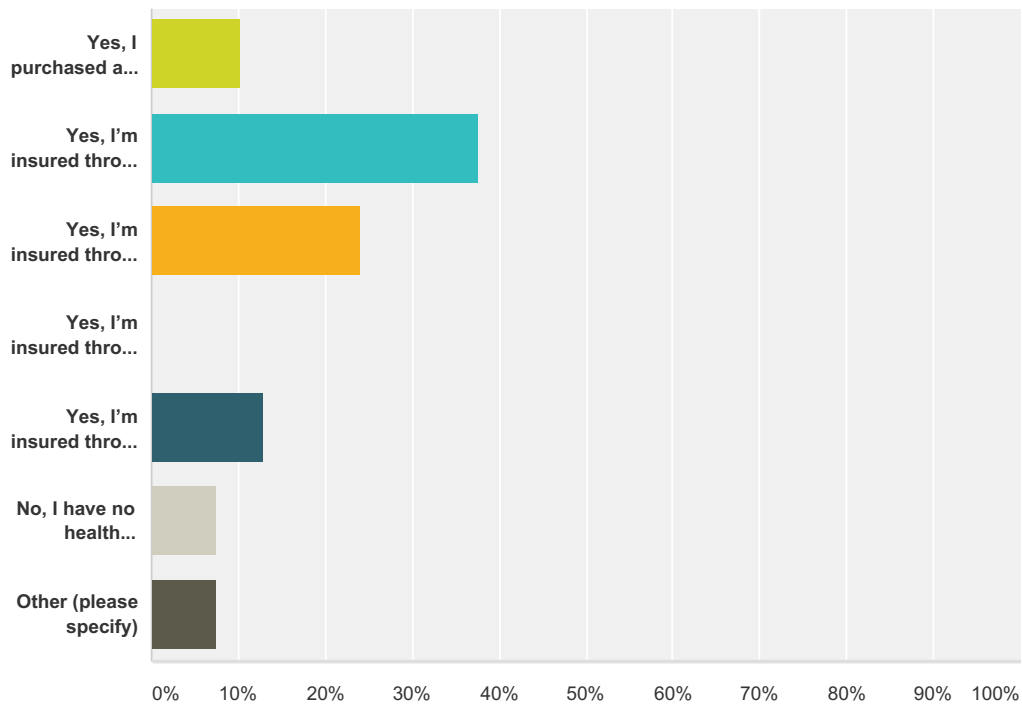

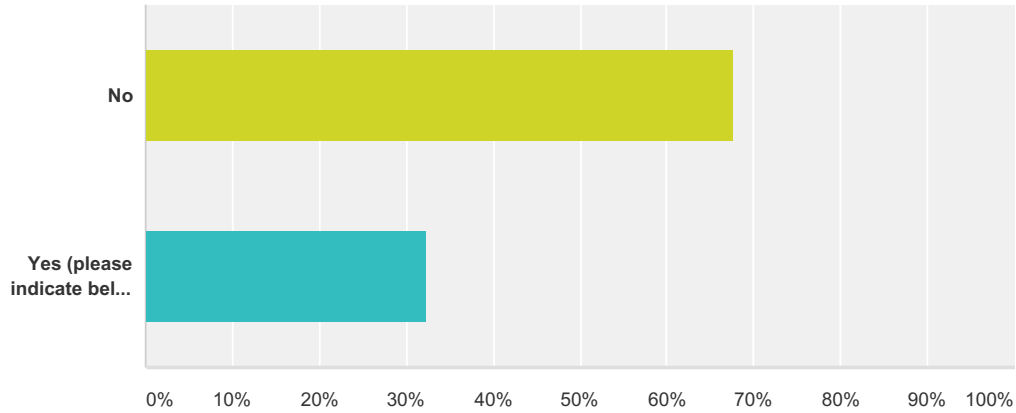

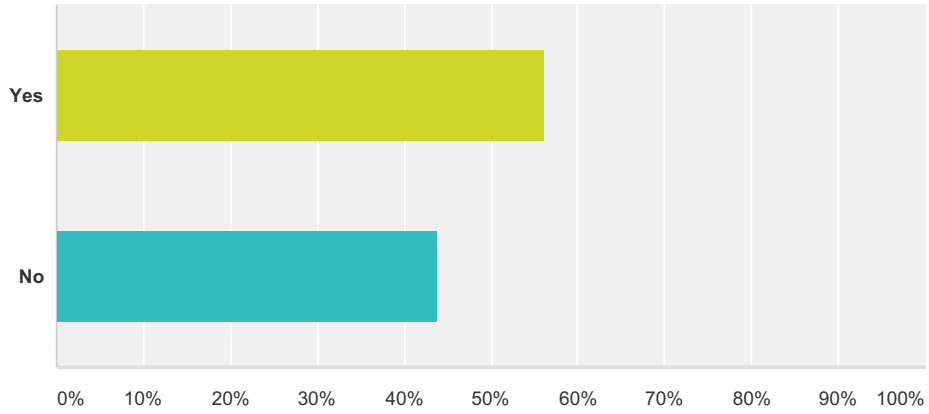

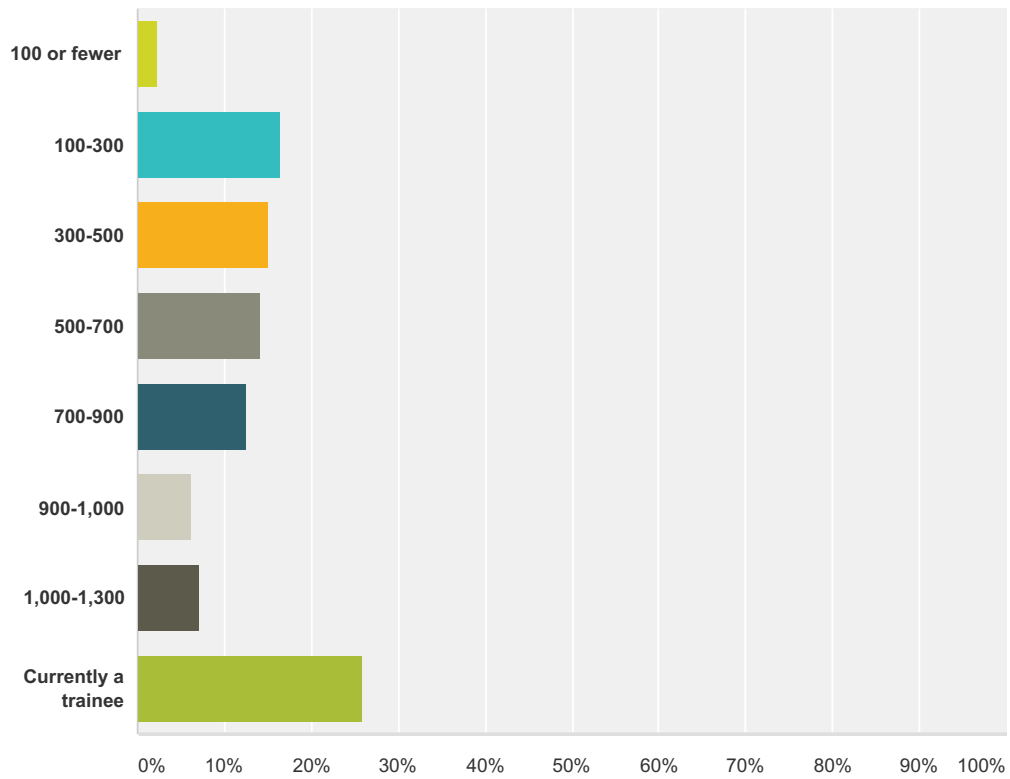

### Q16 How many hours did you gain pre-degree (i.e., while a trainee)?

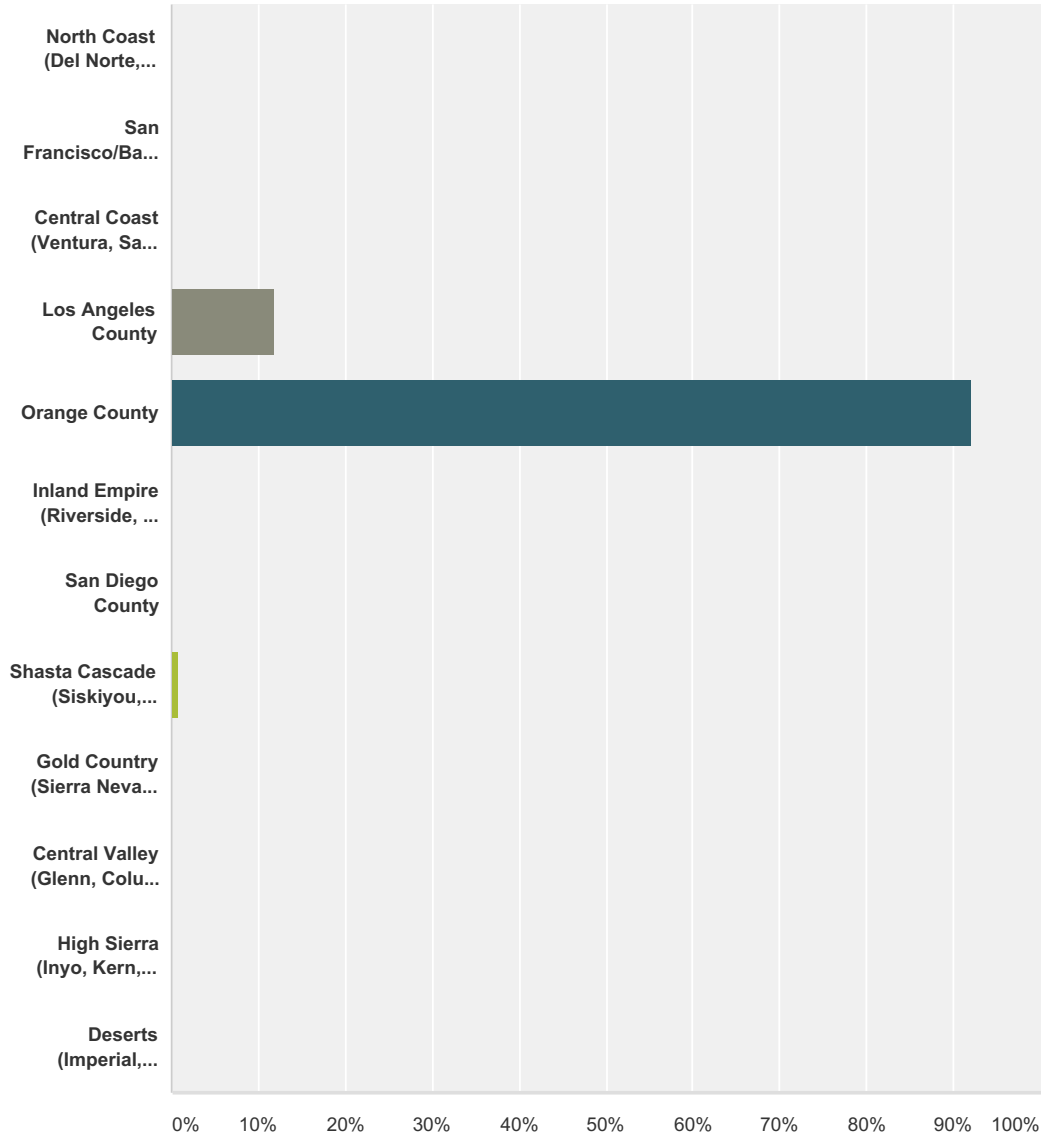

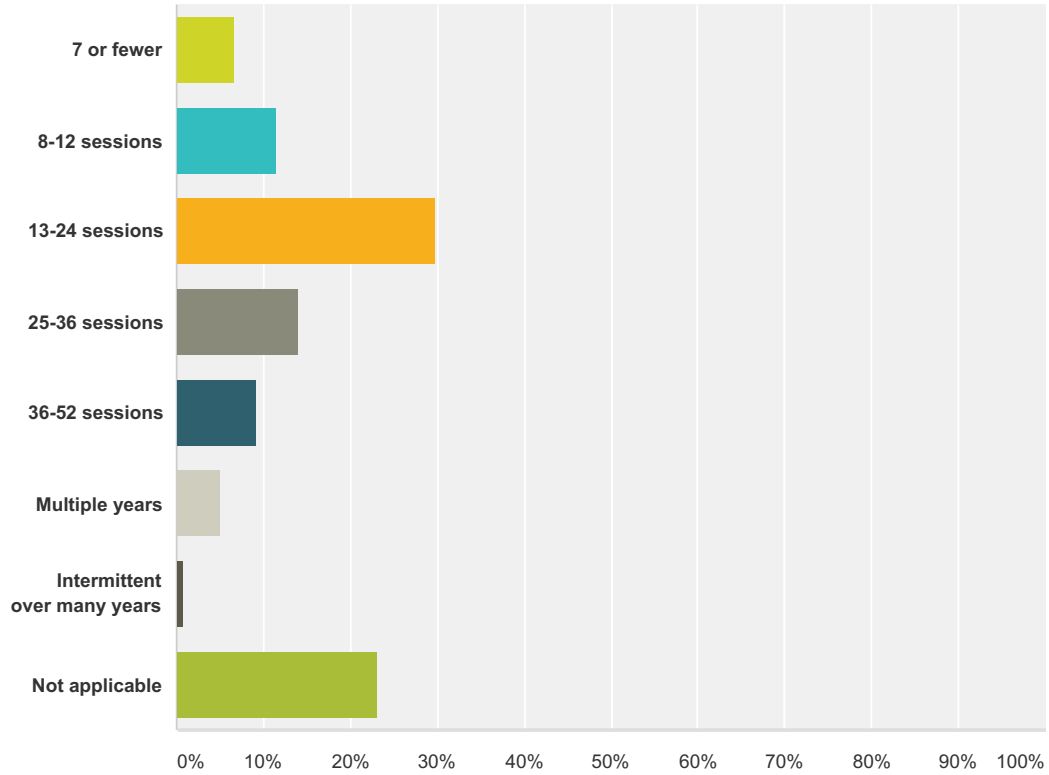

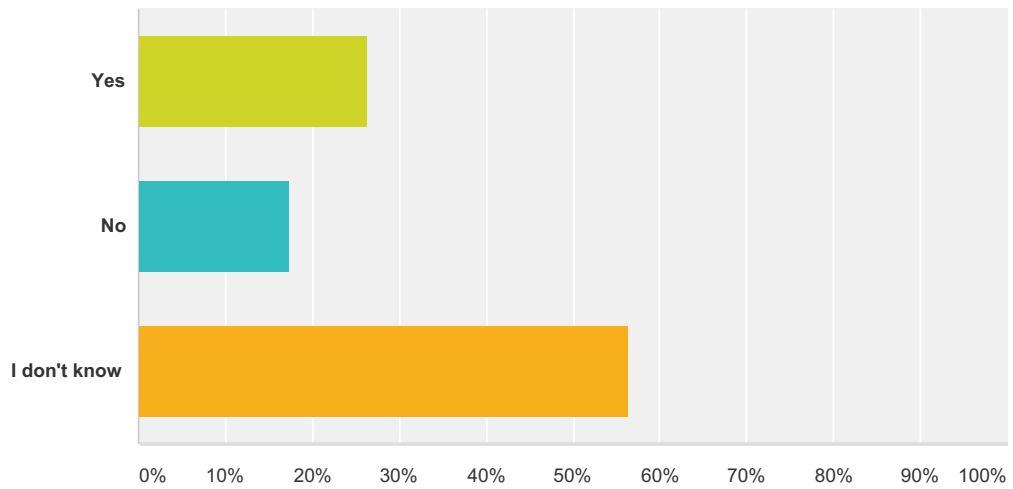

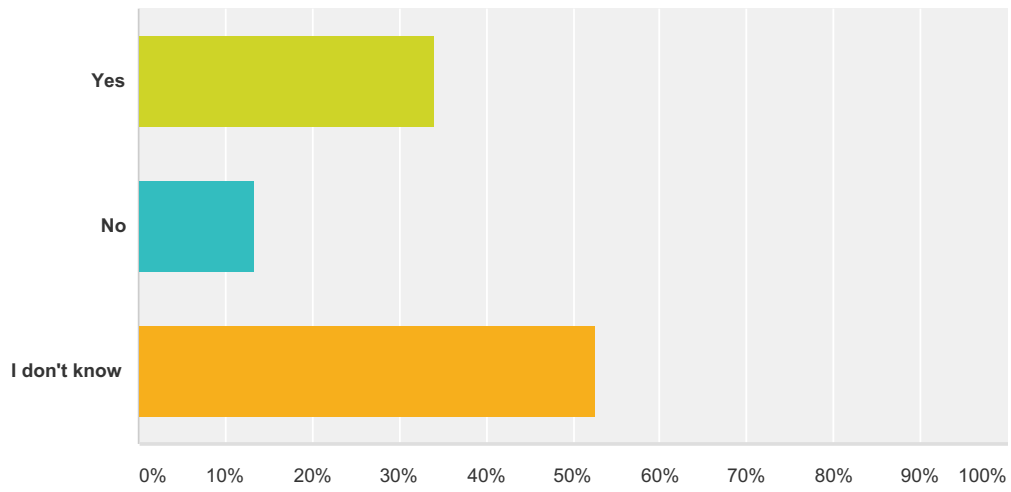

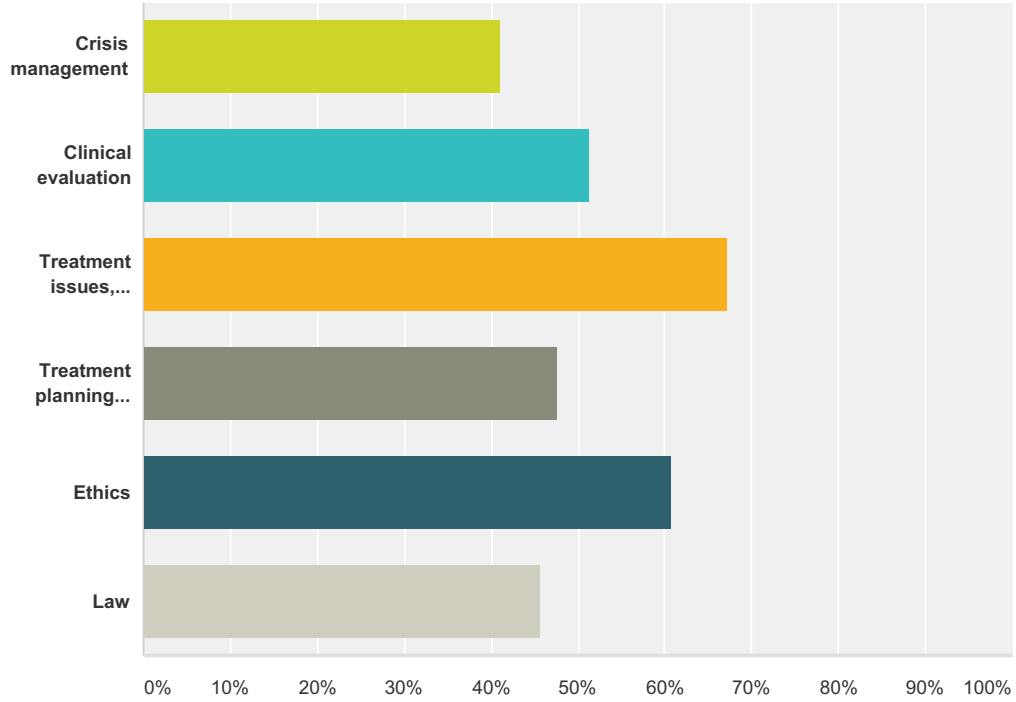

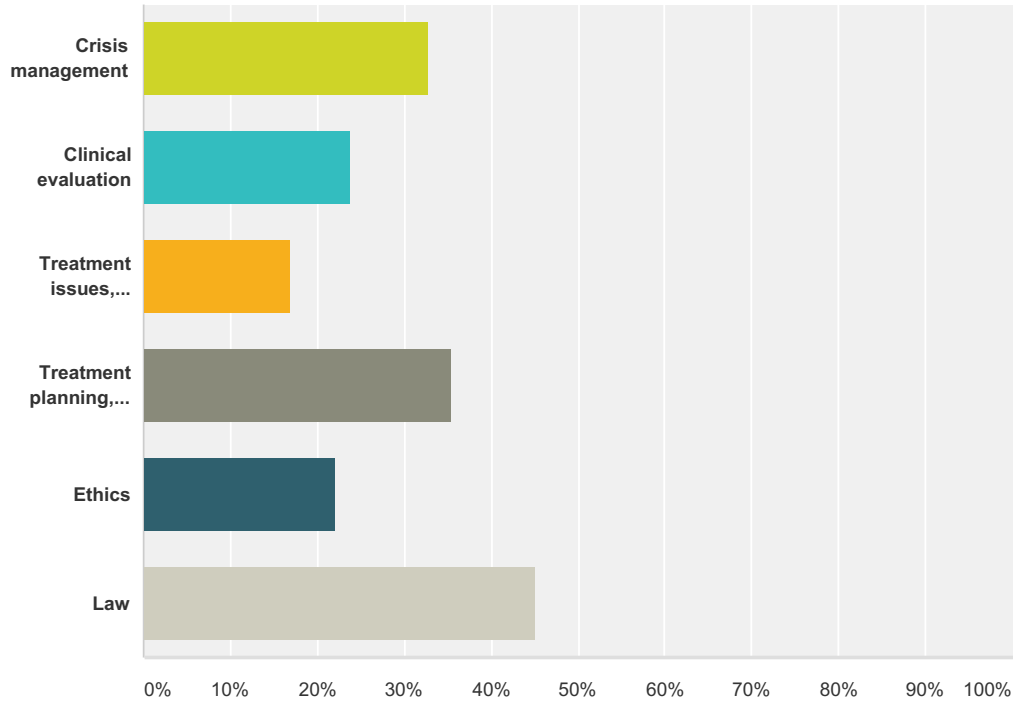

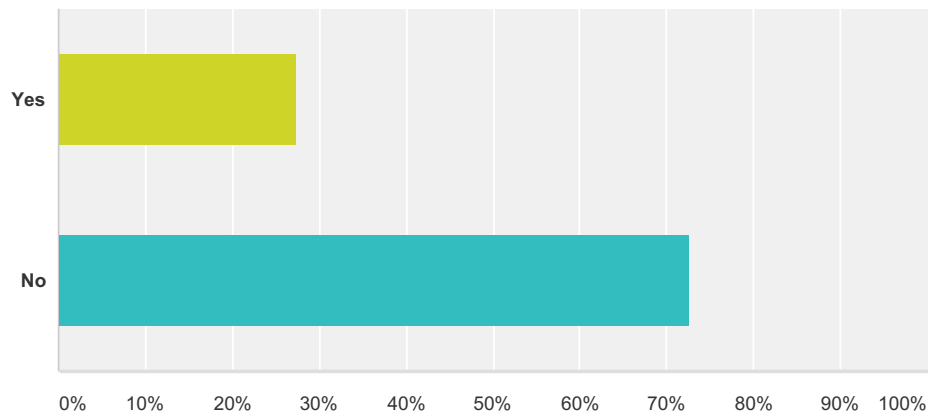

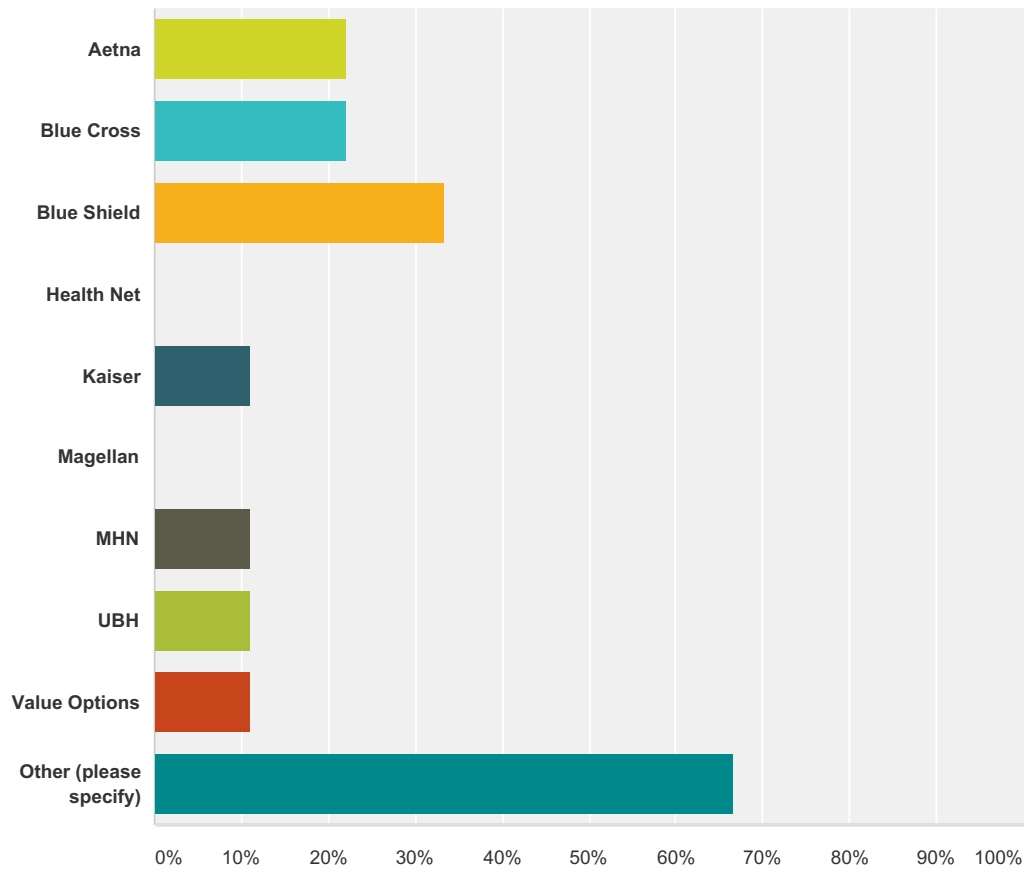

### Q54 Do you advertise your professional services?

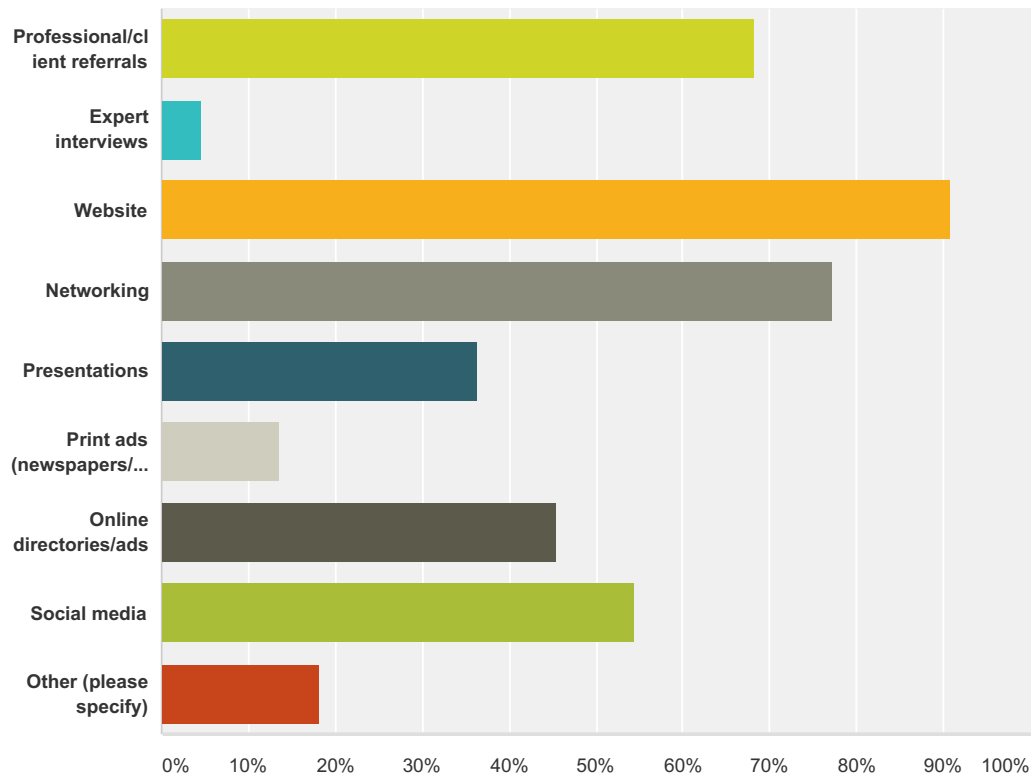

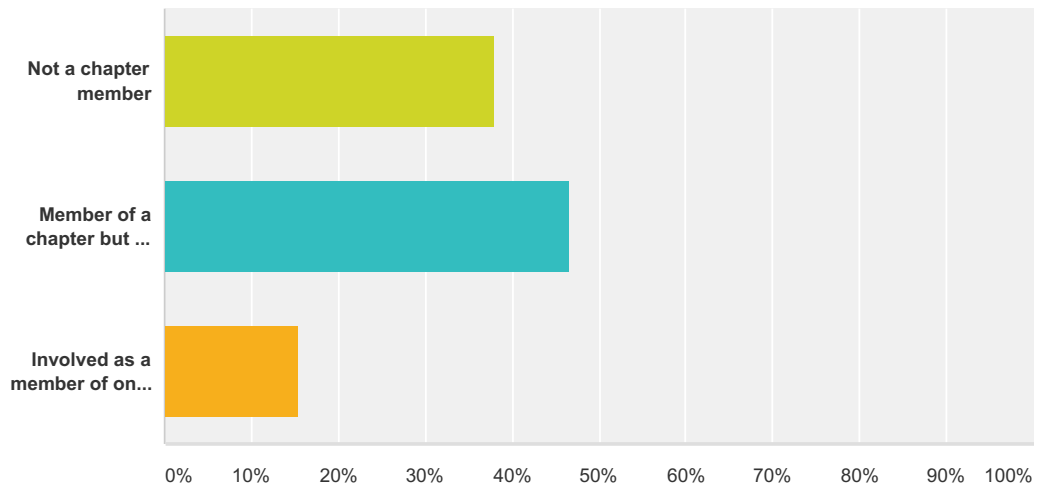

### Q59 Are you involved in one or more CAMFT Chapters?

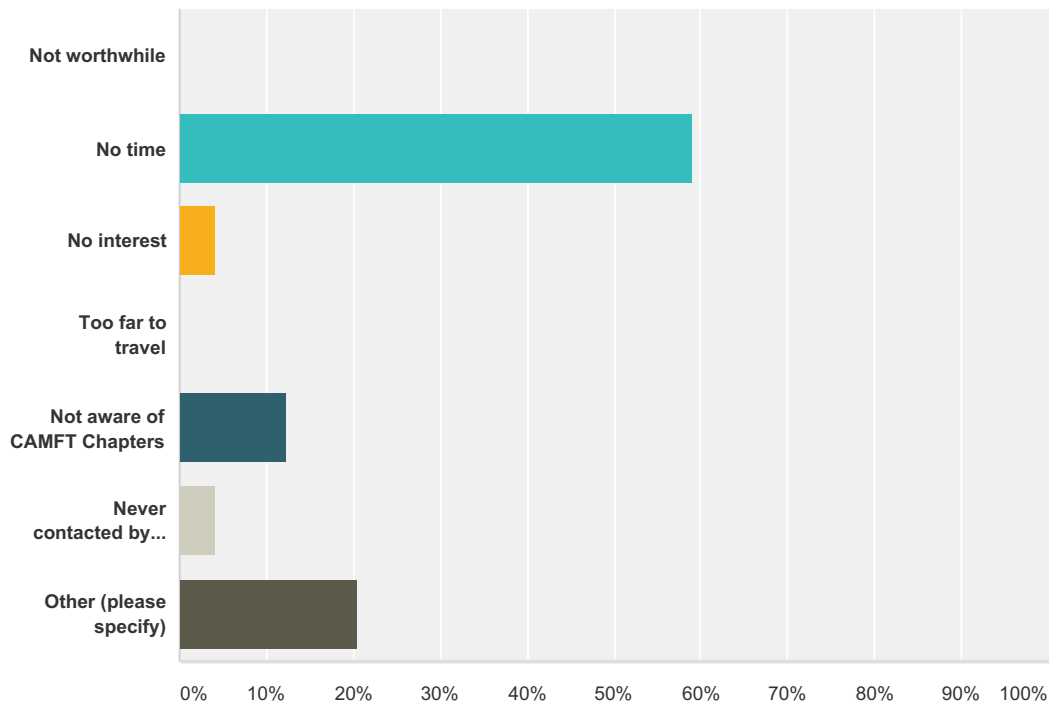
